May 8, 2023

Call to Order / Pledge of Allegiance / Roll Call

A regular meeting of the Whiteford Agricultural School Board of Education was called to order at 6:01 p.m. by Board President Christine Bischoff on May 8, 2023. Members present were Christine Bischoff, Dave Dixon, Mike lott, Shane Hillard, Kristi Mock, and Jeff Bunge. Trustee Janelle Young was absent.

Also present were Superintendent Scott L. Huard, Director of Finance & Business Services Marisa Tebbe-Cousino, Elementary Principal Marcy Anderson, MS/HS Principal Jeremy Fielder, MS/HS Assistant Principal/Athletic Director Jeremy Simmons, and Director of Transportation & Buildings and Grounds Charlie Butz. There were 12 visitors present.

Approval of Agenda

A motion was made by Shane Hillard, seconded by Dave Dixon, to approve the May 8, 2023, Regular Meeting Agenda as presented. Motion approved – 6 yes, 1 absent (Young).

Strategic Plan Progress Monitoring

Superintendent Huard discussed the goal of ensuring all decisions made by the Whiteford Board of Education remain in alignment with the district's Strategic Plan. As an ongoing reminder to the board, Mr. Huard discussed the current plan which centers around maintaining rigorous and relevant curriculum and academic programs, following a core set of values that support a safe and enthusiastic culture and learning environment, implementing plans to attract and retain a highly qualified and motivated staff, and developing and implementing plans for improving and maintaining all district facilities.

Special Presentations

Student Participation – Student Council President Ali Bauman shared the following:

- The Junior/Senior Prom went very well.
- The After-Prom event was enjoyed by all who attended.
- Elections for next year's student council officers will be held soon, and Ms. Bauman plans to attend the June Board of Education Meeting to introduce the new Student Council President/Board Reporter.
- Ag-awareness Day is coming soon, and Ms. Bauman reported that this is a great day for the elementary students to mingle with and be mentored by the older FFA students and to learn all about agriculture.

Leski Wittman Insurance Agency Staff Member of the Month Presentation – Mrs. Sheila Smiddy, MS/HS Building Sub, was recognized as Staff Member of the Month for April and was presented with a \$100 gift card from Chris MacMillan of the Leski Wittman Insurance Agency. Superintendent Huard read from Mrs. Smiddy's nomination forms and shared how much he appreciates her flexibility and the way she works directly with students, especially those who need extra support. Mr. Fielder called Mrs. Smiddy fantastic and expressed his gratitude for all the extra duties she took on while filling a vacancy in the MS/HS main office. Some of the board members expressed how fortunate Whiteford is to have such caring, committed, and hardworking staff like Mrs. Smiddy working for our school. Finally, Mrs. lott shared her admiration and appreciation for all Mrs. Smiddy has done and continues to do for the Whiteford Agricultural School District.

Administrative Reports

<u>Business Office – Mrs. Tebbe-Cousino</u> – Director of Finance & Business Services Marisa Tebbe-Cousino shared the following with the board:

- Mrs. Tebbe-Cousino reported that she recently attended the MSBO (Michigan School Business Officials) Conference in Grand Rapids, Michigan. She stated that it was very beneficial; she learned a lot and made many great contacts from around the state of Michigan and from other Monroe County Public Schools.
- She announced that she is working toward her CFO certification.
- The Business Office is working on finalizing budget amendments and closing out the current fiscal year and working on the budget for the 2023-2024 school year.

Elementary School - Mrs. Anderson - Principal Anderson reported the following:

- Mrs. Anderson began by wishing the board a good evening and proclaimed, "Welcome to May!" (which she shared is always such an exciting time in the elementary building).
- Elementary attendance was at its typically high rate.
- Spring is the time of year that allows staff to see student growth.
- There was an exciting visit in the elementary building from the Chick-fil-A cow, who came
 to honor Whiteford Kindergarten Teacher Emily Nagel and pronounce her the Chick-fil-A
 Teacher of the Year! Mrs. Nagel won free Chick-fil-A for a year, and all elementary
 students and staff received a free breakfast card!
- "Derby de Mayo" was celebrated on May 5th, (a nod to Cinco de Mayo, but instead, Derby, the district's therapy dog, was celebrated as May 5th is her birthday).
- The Daddy/Daughter Dance was well-attended. Principal Anderson expressed that our WPA always does such a great job organizing this event.
- The 3rd through 5th grade students will soon fill out the connectedness survey, which allows students to give their views on Whiteford's academic and social cultures.
- The elementary building is wrapping up testing, and Mrs. Anderson announced that she can't wait to dive into the test results and determine how best to support her students.
- There are many great activities and events coming up in elementary school, including Kindergarten Orientation, Ag Day, Carnival and Track & Field Day, Survivor Day, Fear Factor Day, Kindergarten Graduation, and all of the end-of-year classroom ceremonies.

Middle/High School - Mr. Fielder - Principal Fielder reported the following:

- Mr. Fielder began by sharing that both the middle and high school attendance was in the high 90s range mostly every day.
- It is currently a busy time of year and Mr. Fielder stated that the new MS/HS Administrative Assistant, Amanda Duval, has been great to have on board.
- Spring testing is almost over.
- NWEA testing is being incentivized this year to encourage students to perform their best; donations such as gift cards are now being accepted as incentives. Other incentives include student council-sponsored fun activity days.
- The Whiteford FFA Greenhouse is now open.
- It was reported to Principal Fielder that the Junior/Senior Prom was fantastic (he could not attend due to his recent surgery). He recognized Michelle Delmotte for organizing the event and thanked the many helping hands. He also acknowledged that Principal Anderson's son, Dylan, was crowned Prom King and offered kind, congratulatory remarks.
- Mr. Fielder expressed that it was awesome to see the big After-Prom event brought back.

- Everyone is preparing for all the upcoming Senior Class events.
- Mr. Fielder was thrilled to announce that the Band received all 1s across the board at their state competition.
- The MS/HS awards ceremonies are coming up.
- The middle school students and staff really enjoyed the Mud Hens game.
- Mr. Fielder declared that he is really proud of all the students, stating that we (staff) want to push and challenge them, but also reward them for all their efforts.

<u>Assistant Principal/Athletic Director - Mr. Simmons</u> – Assistant Principal/Athletic Director Jeremy Simmons reported the following:

- Mr. Simmons announced that the spring sports season is wrapping up.
- April was a challenging month due to bad weather cancellations, possibly creating an unusually high number of sporting events in May.
- Mr. Simmons voiced his excitement for the opening of the new High School Gym.
- Fall and winter sports scheduling is already complete, and he is currently working on spring sports scheduling.
- Mr. Simmons declared that this has been a very fast-paced year and he is surprised that
 it is already coming to an end.

<u>Transportation & Buildings and Grounds</u> – Director of Transportation & Buildings and Grounds Charlie Butz reported the following:

- Mr. Butz announced that there are a lot of projects coming up this spring and summer and he is working diligently to "stay ahead of the game."
- He is working with the Director of Finance & Business Services, Marisa Tebbe-Cousino, on budgeting and transparency.
- Mr. Butz is staying involved in planning the next series of bond work, making sure we maximize opportunities and get what we need in phase 3.
- Athletics are rolling and keeping the maintenance and transportation teams very busy.
- Transportation is the most challenging during this time of year, but everything is working out ok.

- 1. <u>District Projected Student/Staff/Space Presentation</u> At the June BOE meeting, I will be providing the Board with an update regarding our projected student enrollment (In-District, Child of Employees, SOC-Siblings, SOC-New), estimated staffing, and space (classrooms/offices) needs.
- 2. <u>Internal Staff Change</u> With Second Grade Teacher Julia Evans taking a one-year unpaid leave of absence, this prompted the following internal staff position change for the 2023-2024 school year: Elementary Special Education Teacher Andrea Young will fill the 3rd Grade Classroom Teacher vacancy. As an update, since we currently have 3 sections of kindergarten, the projected enrollment for 1st grade indicates that we will need a third section of 1st grade to accommodate the advancing students. First round interviews for the open 1st Grade Classroom Teacher position will be held Tuesday, May 9th, 2023.

- 3. Resignations Mr. David DeVantier is resigning from his position as Boys JV Basketball Coach effective today, Monday, May 8, 2023, as he accepted the Varsity Basketball Coach position at Blissfield Schools. We will miss the positive contributions he made to our basketball program, and we wish him all the very best in his new career with the Blissfield school district! Ms. Jaycie Harris is resigning from her position as JV/Assistant Varsity Volleyball Coach effective Thursday, April 27th, 2023. Currently, Ms. Harris feels it is necessary to focus on her family and on working toward her degree in education. We are fortunate that she will continue as an Elementary School Paraprofessional here at Whiteford, and we wish her all the best in her academic endeavors!
- 4. <u>Elementary Summer School 2023</u> We are currently making plans for Summer School 2023. We are gathering staff interest in providing students with a 6-week experience beginning the week of June 27. Summer School would be offered Tuesday-Thursday from 9-11am and 11:45-1:45pm to allow students to attend AM, PM, or full day. There will be no cost to families as we have grant funds allocated to providing Summer School. If we have staff interest, families should be receiving information in the coming weeks and a process to sign their child up.
- 5. <u>Secondary Summer School 2023</u> We will be providing credit recovery classes for students. Credit Recovery mandatory dates are Monday-Thursday from June 12-30 from 9-Noon. A flyer outlining information will also be sent in the coming weeks with details.
- 6. <u>High School Band State Festival Results</u> The High School Band received straight 1s at the State Band Festival on Thursday, April 27th, 2023. Mr. Welling was thrilled as this was the first time the band had received perfect scores across the board since he began his career at Whiteford! Congratulations to the band and to Mr. Welling!
- 7. <u>High School Concert Choir and Chorale State Festival Results</u> The HS Concert Choir and Chorale each received an Excellent rating of "I" at the State level on Thursday, May 4th, 2023. The Middle School Choir doesn't receive an official rating; they attend for a great experience. Mr. Schreiber reported that they had a fantastic performance and received great comments from the judges! Congratulations to Mr. Schreiber and to all his talented singers!

A motion was made by Dave Dixon, seconded by Jeff Bunge, to hire Luke Masserant through EduStaff as the new 8th Grade Basketball Coach at 4% of step 2BA of the current WEA Master Agreement (at no less than \$1522.20) contingent upon favorable previous employer and FBI/State of Michigan background checks. Motion approved – 6 yes, 1 absent (Young).

Teacher Merit Pay

Pursuant to Board Policy 3124.01 – Performance Based Compensation – if a teacher receives an "effective" or "highly effective" rating on their annual year-end evaluation, or was not required to be evaluated due to three (3) consecutive years of "highly effective" ratings, along with other factors, then they may be eligible for additional compensation. A motion was made by Christine Bischoff, seconded by Dave Dixon, that those individuals receiving an effective or highly effective rating for the 2022-2023 school year receive performance-based merit pay of \$100.00. Motion approved – 4 yes, 1 absent (Young), 2 abstained (Bunge, Hillard).
