TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN (TK)

Based upon survey data collected from families in December/January and other considerations, we are moving forward with a Transitional Kindergarten (TK) classroom for the 2024-2025 school year. The program is designed for students who will turn 5 between May 1, 2024-December 1, 2024. Students who turn 5 before May 1, 2024 will also be considered based on screening results. The TK program is limited to 15-18 students. Parents who were unable to attend Kindergarten Round-Up with their student will need to contact the Elementary Principal, Ms. Anderson, at anderson@whiteford.k12.mi.us or 734-856-1443 Ext.104 to set up a screening time for their child. We will begin contacting parents of students who meet the criteria for Transitional Kindergarten after May 1 to seek interest in enrolling in the Transitional Kindergarten program. Entering kindergarten is such an exciting adventure - it's time to enroll your five or soon-to-be five year olds!

For your child to enter kindergarten in the fall, the following items <u>must</u> be completed at registration time, and can be accessed on Whiteford's website under the "Student Registration" tab

- Certified Copy of the Child's Birth Certificate (MUST be presented to register)
- Registration Forms Completed (available on-site and online)
- Bi-lingual Information Completed
- Medical Information Form (MUST be turned in before the start of school)
- Proof of Residency (3 types)
 - o Driver's License with correct Whiteford School District address
 - Paperwork from home purchase or rental agreement/lease
 - A current utility bill, (Gas, electric or landline phone bill --- a cell phone bill will not be accepted)
- Bus Transportation Form (If Applicable)

Note:

As of March 28th, we were notified by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services that we do not need to require the dental screening for the 2024-25 school year. This is different information that we had at our initial kindergarten round up day on March 14. We have since found out that because it is not being offered through the Monroe County Health Department at no cost to families, we do not need to require it this school year. If you happen to get it completed by your local dentist, please drop it off in the office and we will add it to your child's records though.

SEL & Summer Fun

Summer break doesn't mean your child has to stop developing and growing their social-emotional skills! In fact, there are numerous activities available for children to engage in during the summer, aiding in the growth and enhancement of these skills when academic work is not the main focus. Social-emotional learning (SEL) consists of five core competencies (self-awareness, social awareness, self-management, relationship skills, and responsible decision-making) that offer plenty of opportunities for learners to practice any time of year. Keep reading to discover how you can support your child on their social-emotional learning adventure this summer!

Read, Read, Read!

Reading is a self-awareness and relationship-building tool that helps children develop cultural and linguistic skills by exploring emotions, values, and interests through stories. It fosters empathy, broadens understanding, and sparks curiosity. Reading together promotes communication, strengthens bonds, and encourages meaningful conversations.

Write Creative Stories

Writing creative stories can be a fun relationship skillsbuilding activity. Provide your child with a prompt and ask them to write a short story on that subject, considering the characters experiences, thoughts, feelings, and actions. This activity can help to enhance their critical thinking, vocabulary, and communication skills. Collaborative storytelling strengthens bonds and fosters creativity. To add another layer of excitement, you can create a storytelling jar filled with various prompts and scenarios. Let your child pick one at random! This not only makes the activity more engaging but also introduces an element of surprise and spontaneity!

Create a Vision Board

Creating a vision board promotes decision-making and self-awareness. Instruct your child to select images, words, and symbols that resonate with their dreams and goals. Discuss what each image represents and how it aligns with their personal ambitions. This mindful activity also helps with positive thinking, articulating dreams, and planning steps towards achieving their goals. Further, it provides you with insight into their passions!

Plant a Garden

Gardening encompasses thee SEL core competencies: responsible decisionmaking, self-awareness, and self-management. Giving your child the tasks of planting, watering, and nurturing a flower, herb, or plant enables them to care for something and instills a sense of purpose. Since the plant relies entirely on them, it can create a love for the activity, spark interest, develop a hobby, and serve as a stress-reliever. As an added bonus, it encourages spending time outdoors!

Incorporating SEL into Your Summer Learning Routine

Visit Museums

Visiting museums is an educational experience that promotes self- and social awareness. Museums encourage positive mindsets, spark curiosity in science and history fields, and develop critical thinking skills. Interactive exhibits and activities make learning fun and memorable, cultivating a lifelong love for discovery. Museums also offer educational programs that can inspire new interests or career paths.

Volunteer

Volunteering helps us develop responsible decision-making and relationship skills. We are all part of a larger community, encompassing our families, classrooms, friend groups, sports teams, and more. Volunteering allows us to reflect on our own roles within these communities. Whether you offer support at a nursing home, participate in a local park cleanup, or visit an animal shelter to walk the pups, volunteering empowers us to identify and offer support where necessary in the many communities to which we belong

Take Mindful Walks

Taking a mindful walk is a social awareness tool that involves focusing on senses (sight, sound, smell, touch, taste) one at time, describing observations, and connecting with your surroundings. It enhances attention to detail, coping skills, emotional wellbeing, and concentration. You can add mindful walks to your daily summer routine to promote relaxation, reflection, and appreciation for nature, which in turn stimulates mental and emotional growth!

Cook or Bake

Cooking and baking enhance relationship skills, teamwork, collaboration, and problem-solving. Getting active in the kitchen boosts creativity, patience, and perseverance while also encouraging seeking help when it is needed, all of which are crucial skills to develop. Culinary activities create bonding experiences, memories, and traditions while fostering a sense of joy and accomplishment.

- Use your active listening skills






Before you can make big decisions, you need to grow an awareness of your values.
