SPRING COUNT DAY

This Wednesday (2/14) is not only Valentine's Day, but it is our Spring Count Day. The Spring Count Day is mandated through the State School Aid Act, and it is when all public schools in Michigan tally the number of students attending their school. The Fall Count Day counts for 90% of our school funding, while the Spring Count Day accounts for the remaining 10%. Please make sure your child is in attendance on Wednesday (2/14). If they are not in attendance, we are still able to count students under certain guidelines for students that are excused, unexcused, or suspended.

PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

With the start of the 2nd semester, we have the opportunity for parents/guardians to meet for Parent-Teacher Conferences on Tuesday, February 20 from 12-3pm. KINDERGARTEN ROUND-UP

Mark your calendars! Registration Day for Whiteford's incoming kindergarten class for the 2024-2025 school year is March 14th, 2024, from 1pm–7pm in the elementary building. Please secure your time by signing up through the "SignUp Genius" link: <u>Kindergarten Registration</u>. This link can also be accessed through our website: <u>www.whiteford.k12.mi.us</u> by clicking on the Registration button on the home page.

Michigan State Law requires that children entering kindergarten for the 2024-2025 school year must be 5 years of age on or before September 1 of the



upcoming school year – September 1, 2024. The older and more mature your child is when he or she enters school, the greater the chances for academic, social, and emotional success.

For your child to enter kindergarten in the fall, the following items <u>must</u> be completed at registration time, and can be accessed online here:

- Certified Copy of the Child's Birth Certificate (MUST be presented to register)
- Registration Forms Completed (available on-site and online)
- Bi-lingual Information Completed
- Medical Information Form (MUST be turned in before the start of school)
- Proof of Residency (3 types)
 - Driver's License with correct Whiteford School District address
 - Paperwork from home purchase or rental agreement/lease
 - A current utility bill, (Gas, electric or landline phone bill --- a cell phone bill will not be accepted)
- Bus Transportation Form (If Applicable)

NOTE: Further clarification on the kindergarten and new first grade student dental assessment has been brought to our attention by the Monroe County Health Department. The initiative is on pause, so there will be NO DENTAL ASSESSMENT REQUIREMENT FOR INCOMING KINDERGARTNERS OR NEW 1ST GRADE STUDENTS FOR THE 24-25 SCHOOL YEAR!

CLOTHING LOST & FOUND

Positive Self-Talk



Create Awareness of Negative Self-Talk

Negative self-talk can have a significant impact on our mental health and quality of life. However, many people are unaware of the influence that it has on their thoughts and behavior. As a parent or caregiver, you can help your child recognize and overcome negative self-talk at home. Encourage them to identify and challenge negative thoughts and statements about themselves. Together, you can flip these negative thoughts into positive self-talk. For instance, if your child says, "I can't do this," suggest adding the word "yet" to the end of the sentence. This transforms the statement into "I can't do this yet!" - a positive self-talk example that can motivate them to continue to push forward. With practice, positive self-talk can become a habit and lead to a more positive mindset.

En ve Self-Talk

Self-talk is the monologue we have with ourselves, and it can be external (the statements we speak about ourselves aloud), or it can be internal (the thoughts we think about ourselves inside our minds). We may not always be aware when we are engaging in self-talk, but we do it all day long! The messages we send ourselves can intentional or random, and they can also be negative or positive. Negative self-talk can be harmful to our confidence, academic performance, and overall wellbeing. Positive self-talk is an essential coping skill that everyone can benefit from. It can help us change our perspective and enhance our confidence. The key goal of positive self-talk is to teach our minds to identify our strengths, areas for improvement, and driving forces to move forward. This approach helps people realize that their setbacks do not determine their worth, and they can overcome obstacles to reach their goals and dreams. Keep reading to learn how you can support your child in learning and practicing positive self-talk at home!

Focus on Effort

Encouraging children to focus on their effort, rather than just the end result, can be highly beneficial. Whether it's a board game, sports tournament, or test grade, praising the effort they put in is more valuable than only focusing on the outcome. As adults, we understand that life doesn't always go as planned. However, it can be challenging for children to understand this when they put in a lot of effort but don't achieve the expected results. Helping them to understand that it's okay for things to go awry can have a positive impact on their internal and external conversations. Additionally, praising children's efforts encourages them to continue putting in the work and effort. This helps them activate a growth mindset!

Children often feel like they are showing off when acknowledging their strengths Recognizing or identifying their talents. However, understanding one's strengths and areas for growth is a crucial life skill that will benefit them in the long run. A simple way to

Strengths develop this skill is by encouraging your child to reflect on what they appreciate about themselves regularly. Initially, you might need to help them recognize their strengths or discover their talents as they may not see them immediately. By mastering this skill, children can boost their confidence significantly and enhance both their inner and outer monologue.


