The Organizational and Regular Meeting of the Board of Education was held on Thursday, January 12. Here are a few highlights of that meeting:

- 2. The Board Members were recognized for their service to the students, staff, and families of the district. The Board Members were given a certificate of appreciation, a jar of local honey donated by the Drescher Family, and our FFA donated a gift certificate to be used in the school greenhouse this spring!

- 4. In new business, Monica Adams was approved to serve on the Monroe County ISD Parent Advisory Committee for a two-year term.

STUDENT ARRIVAL/DISMISSAL SAFETY

As you may be aware, part of our Bond Series work addresses student and staff arrival and dismissal as we create a new bus loop for dropping off and picking up students. This loop will help alleviate some of our current arrival and dismissal safety concerns with congestion and traffic patterns. Until that work is completed, we are asking families for some help in providing a safer arrival/dismissal process. First, we ask all adults and student drivers to please show kindness, patience, and to be conscious of students or staff walking in the parking lots or crosswalks. Yielding to another vehicle or person is always appreciated in an effort to maintain the safety of all. For arrival, please plan on leaving the house a bit earlier to drop off your child at the school between 7:45-7:55am. At dismissal, our middle/high school students dismiss at 2:55pm, and our student drivers and adults picking up a child are typically leaving the parking lot by 3:00pm. For elementary student pick up, we are asking parents/guardians to please arrive after 3:00pm and closer to 3:10pm to pick up your child. Elementary dismissal is 3:10pm, and having those parents/guardians arrive after 3:00pm will alleviate congestion in an already limited parking lot. Thank you for helping to be the change and provide a safe environment for our learning community!

COMMUNICATION OF CONCERNS

If a concern or problem arises, it is important that the proper lines of communication are followed. Concerns regarding your child and their educational or athletic experience should be expressed directly with the staff member or coach that it most closely involves and should occur at an appropriate time, place, and with a professional tone. For our older students and athletes, we encourage them to self-advocate with the appropriate staff member or coach. Self-advocacy allows our students and athletes to speak up for themselves, make their own decisions, problem-solve, and develop self-determination. If the student or athlete needs support from a parent/guardian after speaking with a staff member or coach, then the parent should contact the staff member or coach to set up a date, time, and location for a meeting with the student or athlete as appropriate. This provides a process whereby staff members and coaches closest to the situation have an opportunity to understand the student/parent concern, share information that might be helpful to the student/parent understanding, and collaboratively determine next steps towards a solution. In all situations, it is important to presume positive intentions and have an attitude of seeking to understand the situation from both sides. If this meeting does not produce a satisfactory resolution, then the principal or athletic director should be contacted to discuss the situation. If not resolved, then the superintendent can be contacted for further discussion and support.
