Dear Bobcat Family,

The year 2020 has been anything but typical as we continue to navigate the uncharted waters of COVID-19. - Design for the new 8-lane asphalt track, long jump, pole vault, discus, shotput and fencing were successfully completed by Foresite Design and issued for competitive bids in the spring.
- As awarded at the May Board meeting, Salenbien Trucking & Excavating based out of Dundee will be handling all site work, utilities and installation of the asphalt track and other track events, Goddard Coatings out of Pontiac will be installing the track surfacing, and Action Traffic Maintenance out of Flint will be installing the fencing.

ANNUAL NOTICES

<u>AHERA—ASBESTOS</u>: As required by the Federal Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), this is inform you that the documentation for our District Asbestos Management Plan, the semiannual surveillance inspections (continued monitoring of remaining floor tile in our buildings) and the three-year reinspection are available for your review in the Superintendent's Office. Information regarding response actions may also be found in the District Asbestos Management Plan.

CONCEALED WEAPONS: State law establishes a "Weapon-Free School Zone" that extends 1,000 feet from the boundary of any school property.

The term "weapon" means any object which, in the manner in which it is used, is intended to be used, or is represented, is capable of inflicting serious bodily harm or property damage, as well as endangering the health and safety of persons. Weapons include, but are not limited to, firearms, guns of any type, including air and gas-powered guns (whether loaded or unloaded), knives, razors, clubs, electric weapons, metallic knuckles, martial arts weapons, ammunition, and explosives.

As a School District, we have policies prohibiting the possession of weapons on school property, inside school buildings, and at school events. Obviously, weapons are not appropriate in a school environment.

These restrictions shall not apply in the following circumstances to persons who are properly licensed to carry a concealed weapon:

- A. A parent or legal guardian of a student of the school may carry a concealed weapon while in a vehicle on school property if s/he is dropping off or picking up the student from the school, and any person may carry a concealed weapon solely in the parking lot.
- B. A county corrections officer, a member of a sheriff's posse, a police or sheriff's reserve or auxiliary officer, a State Department of Corrections parole or corrections officer, a private investigator, a Michigan State Police motor carrier officer or capitol security officer, a state court judge, a security officer required by the employer to carry a concealed weapon while on the premises, a court officer, a parole, probation, or corrections officer or absconder recovery unit member of the Department of Corrections if that individual has obtained a Michigan D of C weapons permit.
- C. Retirees of the abovementioned law officials with the same proper training and weapons permits with the exception of retired sheriff's posse or reserve auxiliary officers and retired security officer.

These are very limited exceptions and do not change the district policy that firearms, pistols, and other dangerous weapons are prohibited on school property. Parents and legal guardians are strongly discouraged from bringing concealed weapons on school property even while in a vehicle for pick-up or drop-off of their student. We urge those individuals authorized to carry a weapon to refrain from doing so while in a vehicle on school grounds or while attending a school sponsored event in respect for the safety of our students.

PETS ON DISTRICT GROUNDS: Students play and conduct class and athletic practices on district grounds on a regular basis. Please help us keep our grounds clean and clear of pet debris by not bringing your pet on the district's grounds. ALL animals (except service animals) are prohibited from being on school property unless approved by the administration.

SCHOOL ZONES: Parents, student drivers and district residents are reminded of the reduced speed (25 mph) in posted "School Zones" on Consear and Sylvania-Petersburg Roads. The reduced speed is in effect from 7:30 AM—8:30 AM and 2:30 PM—3:30 PM. Fines are <u>DOUBLED</u> in these designated areas. To ensure the safety of our children and those approaching the district buildings, please adhere to these speed limits.

<u>USE OF TOBACCO ON SCHOOL PREMISES</u>: In compliance with P.A. 140 of 1993, no person at anytime shall smoke, chew, or otherwise use tobacco products, of any kind, in any school building, at school sponsored events, on School District property, on property under the control of the School District, nor in School District vehicles. This policy is in effect twenty-four (24) hours a day, 365 days a year.

<u>WATER QUALITY COMPLIANCE SUMMARY</u>: Due to amendments to the Safe Drinking Water Act, 1976 PA 399, K-12 schools and day care facilities that are non-transient, non-community water supplies are required to prepare and make available for inspection an annual water quality report from the previous calendar year.

FOOD SERVICE FAQS

<u>Can my child(ren) eat breakfast at school?</u> YES; breakfast is offered daily for all students from 7:30 AM—8:00 AM in the elementary cafeteria and 7:30 AM—7:55 AM in the middle/high school cafeteria. Students wishing to eat breakfast should enter the café through the designated side entrances.

Where can I find the monthly menus? An interactive menu from our food service provider can be found under the Food Service tab on the district's website (OUR DISTRICT / FOOD SERVICE / then scroll down to the MONTHLY MENUS heading). The menus provide many details regarding the food items served in the district (i.e., nutritional information, allergens, etc.).

How much does breakfast and/or lunch cost? Prices for the 2020-2021 school year are:

Milk (grades K-12).......\$0.50 Elementary Lunch\$2.75 (\$.40 reduced) Breakfast (grades K-12)......\$1.10 (\$.30 reduced) MS/HS Lunch\$3.10 (\$.40 reduced)

Where can I find an application for Free/Reduced Price Meals? Families are encouraged to annually submit applications for free or reduced priced meals—this includes breakfast and lunch. If you have an Internet connection available, you may find it more convenient to complete the application online at www.lunchapp.com. A link to this site is available on the district's website (OUR DISTRICT / FOOD SERVICE / then scroll down to the right under the IMPORTANT LINKS heading). A paper copy of the application is also available by contacting your child's respective building office.

What is the Meal Magic® Point of Sale System? Whiteford Schools utilizes a computerized sale system for breakfast and lunch sales, which greatly benefits students, parents and staff alike. Each student has their own account and funds stay with the student until they graduate or leave the district. The most efficient use of the Meal Magic® POS system is to put money on your child's account on a regular basis to insure sufficient funds are available for all meal sales. Meal Magic deposit envelopes are available near each building office.

What happens if my child has a negative balance on their account? Students will be provided with an alternate meal that meets all established dietary requirements should they not have adequate funds to purchase a meal for the day; however, parents should note that they are responsible for the cost of any alternate meals provided to their child(ren). These balances must be paid in full as soon as possible.

How do I know if my child is in the negative or has a low balance? Automatic notifications are sent to the email address of the primary contact of the student twice weekly (Wednesday and Saturday evenings) for students whose balance falls below \$5.00. You can also view account balances 24/7 at mealmagic.whiteford.k12.mi.us/mealmagic/mylunchaccount. A link to this site is available on the district's website (OUR DISTRICT / FOOD SERVICE / then scroll down to the right under the IMPORTANT LINKS heading).

- Focus on social-emotional learning and mental health supports.

Preparing for virtual learning (if conditions change)

- Students meet with assigned teachers and class virtually Monday through Friday.
- Teachers will use a virtual platform, proven effective for virtual environments (Calvert, Plato).
- Curriculum is aligned to state standards, keeps student on track to return to inperson learning.
- Curriculum is adjusted to meet each student's needs and addresses grade level concepts.
- Enrichment/Specials classes available.
- Devices will be available for all students K-12.
- Emphasis placed on maintaining connections and building relationships.

Students on track to return to school (if conditions change)

Option 2:

100% Virtual Learning at Home

(For parents uncomfortable sending their child into the building)



- Students meet with Highly Qualified Teacher virtually Monday through Friday.
- K-5 students will use the Calvert Platform from Edmentum.
- 6-12 students will use the Plato platform from Edmentum.
- Both platforms are proven effective for learning in a remote environment.
- Curriculum is aligned to state standards, keeps student on track to return to in-person learning.
- Curriculum is adjusted to meet each student's needs and addresses grade level concepts.
- Enrichment/Specials classes available.
- Devices will be available for all students K-12.

Is the virtual program the same program as we experienced in the Spring?

- No, districts were closed in the Spring with no time to prepare, develop a robust remote learning program, or train teachers.
- The Edmentum platforms are different than we used in the Spring. The platform is more organized and student/parent friendly. Assignments are organized on weekly calendars for parents to be able to easily track their child's progress on assignments.
- Students will be taught new skills and learning will move forward.
- The highly qualified teachers are trained in remote learning and have experience teaching virtually.
- A Zoom informational meeting will be scheduled for parents interested in the virtual option. The meeting is scheduled for August 19th at 7:30 p.m.
- Parents are asked to commit for a semester when enrolling their child in the virtual program.
