Thanks for all that you have given me, I will always be a Bobcat!





SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE...

Dear Bobcat Family,

It is hard to believe that three months of school has already passed! Our Bobcats are fully Engaged in their Learning, Encouraged by their Community, and Empowered for their Future! As a newcomer to the district, I have been so impressed with the level of generosity shown by our students, staff, families, and community. During the month of November, our students and staff had the opportunity to participate in food drives at the elementary, middle, and high schools. The Thanksgiving Food Drives were sponsored by student-led groups in both buildings with the goal of providing food for those in need this holiday season. 

The Sophomore Class secured a third place standing in the float building contest with their tremendous sea-inspired representation of the Navy










FFA NEWS

Broiler Contest: Whiteford's 8th grade Agriculture Explore and High School Zoology classes competed in the Michigan FFA Broiler Contest at Munsell's Poultry Processing in Fowlerville, Michigan on Thursday, November 4th. Students in these classes raised groups of 25 chickens from just a couple days old up to 6 weeks. During that time, students were in charge of feeding and caring for their birds and keeping accurate records of feed consumed, as well as the weight of their birds.

Each team created mixed rations with different proteins and fat levels for their chickens to test growth. At the end of the project, teams made a 15 page report of their project in-

report of their project including graphs, pictures, answers to written questions, and figured project statistics. Finally, each team chose their best 5 birds to be judged on the contest date. Below are the results:
