

2020 ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES AND FAN OF THE YEAR AWARD

Three new inductees took their place in the Whiteford High School Athletic Hall of Fame Friday, February 14th, during a brief ceremony, Milly lott, Jake DuPree and Tony DuPree are the newest members of the Hall of Fame.

Tony DuPree graduated from Whiteford in 1983 after an outstanding athletic career that saw him play three sports for the Bobcats. He was a starter on the basketball team that won two TCC championships. During the 1981-82 season, he played alongside brothers Warren and Everett.

It was on the football field that DuPree created a faithful following of fans. He rushed for a then-school record 1,442 yards during his season, leading the Monroe County Region in yards and touchdowns. He was a threat to score a touchdown seemingly every time he touched the football and helped the Bobcats into the state rankings at one point during the 1982 season – its first time in the state rankings since the mid-1960s.

Jake DuPree, nephew of Tony DuPree, was a 1,000-point scorer in basketball for Whiteford and Monroe County Region scoring champion during his career. He also was a starting receiver on the Bobcat football that made it into the state playoffs his senior year.

Milly lott earned her induction into the Hall of Fame by being named All-State in softball after her senior season in 2019. lott was a key member of a Bobcat team that won multiple championships over the past four seasons.

The Athletic Hall of Fame was created by former Whiteford Athletic Director John Flynn in the late 1980s. Plaques are on display for all of the Hall of Fame athletes and coaches outside of the Whiteford Gymnasium.



Whiteford's Cari Hayes, who has been the official photographer for Whiteford athletics for the last several years, was honored Friday as the Boosters Fan of the Year.. Hayes is in her final months of taking photographs of Whiteford sporting events. The Boosters annually honors a Whiteford fan for their dedication and commitment to the Whiteford sports community. Hayes began taking photos several years ago, replacing longtime photographer Debbie Vaughn. She has followed the Bobcats across the state, taking photographs and documenting championship runs and sporting events. She also annually takes team photographs and individual player photos.

The 2019-2020 school year marks the end of our 5 year strategic plan (2015-2020). That plan was written by a committee of district stakeholders (parents, students, staff, administrators, community members) during the 2015-2016 school year. At that time, the team was instrumental in creating a new district mission statement "Engage, Encourage, Empower" as well as writing a strategic plan that would guide the district in making improvements to the educational experience for our students. After the strategic plan was written and approved by the Board of Education, the staff at Whiteford Schools got to work on bringing the plan to life. 

On Saturday, January 4th we participated in the FIRST Robotics kickoff event, this is the reveal for the 2020 robotics competition season challenge. This year's competition is titled "Infinite Recharge" and is Star Wars themed. The game challenges include collecting special foam balls, called power



cells, and delivering them to a target that has three different goals, for three different point values. Also as part of the challenge there is a spinning color wheel that needs to be set to a predetermined color and finally the robots need to climb up onto an elevated

rock while mov pret and gam We we

rocker switch bar and hang off the ground, while working with your teammates to keep the movable bar level. This season's challenge is pretty cool! We have already started to design and build our robot and are working out our game strategy.



is any sort of play/creation/activity where a child is not given guidelines or directions on how to build/create/craft. This does NOT include things like video games, board games, "how to"

crafts, and others. While these things are not inherently negative, they all have an end goal or target that children are given by adults or the creators.

February 5 this year was GSPD and in 4th grade, we took total advantage of it! We spent a half hour enjoying building, crafting, and playing with friends and classmates. Students were given blocks, legos, colored paper and craft supplies, STEM kits, and more, to express their individuality and practice problem solving with peers. We enjoyed seeing pictures of dogs and cats being drawn, Lego castles and cars being made, marble run towers constructed, and more! We LOVE being able to celebrate being a kid!!!
