“I’m going to Bethany college to play golf and then to the Air Force. I’m excited to get away from Whiteford and experience new things.” - **Connor Lenhart**

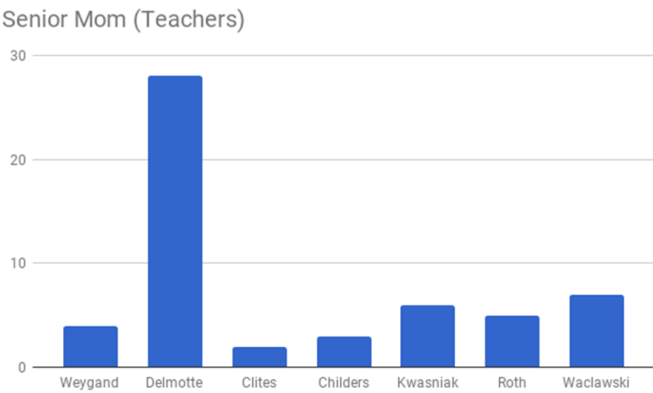
